The City of Tomah applied for and was awarded a grant for \$250,000 to use towards the formerly blighted property across the street from City Hall. This grant money will go towards the loan that the City provided to 3rd Gen, LLC from the TID. In attendance were the Lieutenant Governor, Rebecca Kleefisch, Representative Nancy Vandermeer and Senator Patrick Testin as well as city officials and representatives from the WEDC. Tomah was one of three communities that received grants from the WEDC. The total amount awarded was \$625,000. Congratulations, Tomah, on this achievement!



Changes, improvements coming in 2018 to Pine View Campground

As the 2018 camping season gets into full swing at Fort McCoy's Pine View Campground, visitors will see noticeable changes as the season progresses.

Open year-round, Pine View Campground is part of Pine View Recreation Area. This area also includes Whitetail Ridge and Sportsman's Range.

The campground is nestled in a wooded area about a quarter mile west of Fort McCoy's cantonment area and is bounded by Suukjak Sep Lake on the east and the La Crosse River on the west and south.

Ten new cabins are being built this year – eight on the east side and two on the west side of the lake. The existing cabins see a lot of use, and the new ones will be a major addition to the campground's facilities.

The mini-golf course at the campground also in under renovation.

Along the La Crosse River on hiking trails next to the campground, a new pedestrian bridge is being finished to span the river to allow for better access to all the hiking trails. There are more than 5 miles of hiking and biking trails throughout the entire recreation area.

The bridge was built through a \$171,000 contract with NuGen Johnson LLC of Sussex, Wis. The bridge is expected to be fully completed and landscaped by this summer.

Additionally, the campground is plotting its hiking and biking trails in order to create a better map for its customers.

Suukjak Sep Lake, which is in the heart of the campground, provides opportunities for fishing, boating, and swimming or sunbathing on its sandy beach. On April 30, the lake was freshly stocked with more than 4,200 rainbow trout for anglers to try catching.

Among the other features of the campground are picnic and playground areas (one handicapped accessible), a camp store, and the Recreational Equipment Checkout Center. Members of the Fort McCoy community and the public may use the campground.

The campground features 160-plus campsites, both nonelectric tent sites and recreational vehicle/trailer pads with electrical hookups. Of these, 121 sites have full hookups for water, sewer, electricity, and cable TV.

Each site is equipped with a fire pit and a picnic table; each camping circle features a shower/restroom complex.

People are calling us because we're the company that "knows things", can find things, can make referrals in our sleep, and is the most relevant go-to for information. The number of calls and questions we get also indicates that

we are the trusted source of information.

While we do get the occasional funny call, most of the calls we receive are from people looking for products and services and conclude with a direct referral to a member business. Your membership matters not only to our organization, but to those in the public that call us for information. Without you


